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## INTRODUCTION

### SURVEY OF VETERINARY MEDICAL LIBRARIES IN THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA

The following survey was produced by the Survey Committee of the Veterinary Medical Libraries Section of the Medical Library Association. At the Section's 1992 Annual Meeting, members requested that the Committee conduct a brief survey of "critical" data **every** year, with an extensive survey every three years. For the 1998/99 data, it is an extensive survey.

There are 31 academic veterinary medical libraries in the United States and Canada. This is the first time an online version of the survey questionnaire was available for participating libraries to download and submit. Due to retirements and some other unmitigated circumstances, only 22 libraries participated in this survey. The data was compiled by Ross C. Edmonds, Eleanor Garrison, and Victoria T. Kok at the University Libraries at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University.

### GROUPING THE LIBRARIES

The libraries are grouped following the format established with the 1983/84 survey.

- Group 1:* a separate library that serves primarily the faculty, staff and students of schools of veterinary medicine. This is the most common situation.
- Group 2:* the veterinary collection is housed in separate locations – campus library and a clinical library. Information is reported for the clinical library.
- Group 3:* a separate library unit that serves two or more curricula, including veterinary medicine. These are usually the largest libraries in the survey and include medical, agriculture and general university library collections.
